A (Very) Brief Overview

Let's talk briefly about the Los Angeles Public Library and e or electronic resources. The library has many of these eResources available to its library card holders, which means you can access the library anytime from anywhere and can even be a library power user without ever setting foot in an actual library building.

E-resources include

- Books of all types and for all ages that can be downloaded to your device or streamed over the internet.
- Magazine titles that range from the obscure to the very recognizable and are available to you in magazine layout format
- Newspapers from all over the world in their original format or pulled apart by article.
- Audiobooks to stream or download.
- Our music service, Freegal, allows you to download 5 drm free titles a week to keep and you can stream your own customized playlists continuously, a free alternative to online music subscription services.
- Hoopla & Knaopy allow you to stream all kinds of movies and TV programs while Digitalia has a selection of foreign films for viewing.

The most interesting thing to note is that this is by no means a comprehensive list. We also have many databases geared at helping you with your research in whatever area you have an interest.
