Some of the areas this committee will emphasize on, but not limited to, are: parent participation and involvement in education, school safety, advocating for parent rights, local public school issues, nutrition and health related concerns affecting families, domestic violence, college/university preparedness, youth leadership development and youth employment.

En su caso y con la aprobación HHPNC, el Comité formulará recomendaciones a los organismos rectores pertinentes, funcionarios electos, organizaciones y foros informativos anfitrión en cuestiones particulares de la familia, la juventud y la educación que afectan a nuestra comunidad.

Con el fin de defender, apoyar y proporcionar recursos informativos sobre temas de desarrollo y liderazgo juvenil, familias sanas, y la educación pública de calidad, este comité colaborará y asociarse con organizaciones locales de la comunidad sin fines de lucro, funcionarios municipales y departamentos, bibliotecas públicas y escuelas públicas con sede en Highland Park.
