Ross Stephenson, owner of The Hermosillo, a beer and wine bar, requested Historic Highland Park Neighborhood Council support for their proposed construction of additional outdoor seating for 20 people.

The Historic Highland Park Neighborhood Council opposes the addition of a 20-seat outdoor patio. The Motion was denied. The added seating would bring more people consuming alcohol to our business corridor which has already exceeded both State and City limits to liquor licenses. Our community is concerned how this will affect parking, potential accidents, trash,

security risks, etc. in the area. Our community highly values an atmosphere of safety and welcome, not drinking in public and its associated problems.

In addition Mr. Stephenson, is hoping to open a new bar on 56 and York Blvd. HHPNC represents over 60,000 Los Angeles stakeholders who reside, own property, or conduct business in our neighborhood.
