The Historic Highland Park Neighborhood Council (HHPNC) represents over 60,000 Los Angeles Stakeholders who reside, own property, or conduct business in the neighborhood of Highland Park. We SUPPORT council file 19-0882 instructing the Department of Recreation and Parks and the Department of General Services to report on the feasibility and costs to providing feminine hygiene products at no cost at all restrooms in City-owned facilities. Feminine hygiene products are essential health items and as such are necessary for personal hygiene and public health.
